Aims of the Course:

- To prepare students to become well-informed and effective communicators.
- To give students a profound understanding of their chosen language.
- To appeal to students by basing the study around lifestyle and social topics of interest.
- To equip students with a qualification which will offer broad career options.

Programme of Study:

A01 Understand and respond in writing to spoken language drawn from variety of sources. 20%

A02 Understand and respond in writing to written language drawn from a variety of sources. 30%

A03 Manipulate the language accurately, in written form, using a range of lexis and structure 30%

A04 Show knowledge and understanding of and respond critically and analytically, to, different aspects of the culture and society of countries/communities where the language is spoken. 20%
